Speaking of us humans, let's look at how these many-legged creatures fit into our world. Centipedes play an essential role in nature by controlling other insect populations. While some people might get a little creeped out by them, they are generally harmless and prefer to run away than fight. 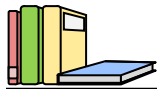
